API ANTITRUST GUIDELINES

- No discussion or forecasting of prices for goods or services by or received by a company.
- No sharing or discussing any company's confidential or proprietary information.
- No discussion of any company's specific purchasing plans; merger/divestment plans, production information, inventories or costs.
- No sharing or discussion of specific company compliance costs, unless publicly available.
- No agreement or discussion regarding the purchase or sale of goods or services (such decisions are independent company decisions).
- No discussion on how individual companies intend to respond to potential market/economic scenarios or government action: discussion limited to generalities.
- No disparaging remarks regarding specific vendors, products or services.

WHAT IS A MATURITY MODEL

- Measures: degree to which the Pipeline SMS is comprehensive, systematic, and integrated throughout an organization
- Allows the operator to objectively determine the
 - strengths and weaknesses of its personnel and processes that support PSMS
 - areas of its PSMS needing improvement.

Maturity: A point at which the safety management system has become embedded into the processes of an organization and planned activities are completed and planned results achieved regularly, without gaps. – API RP 1173

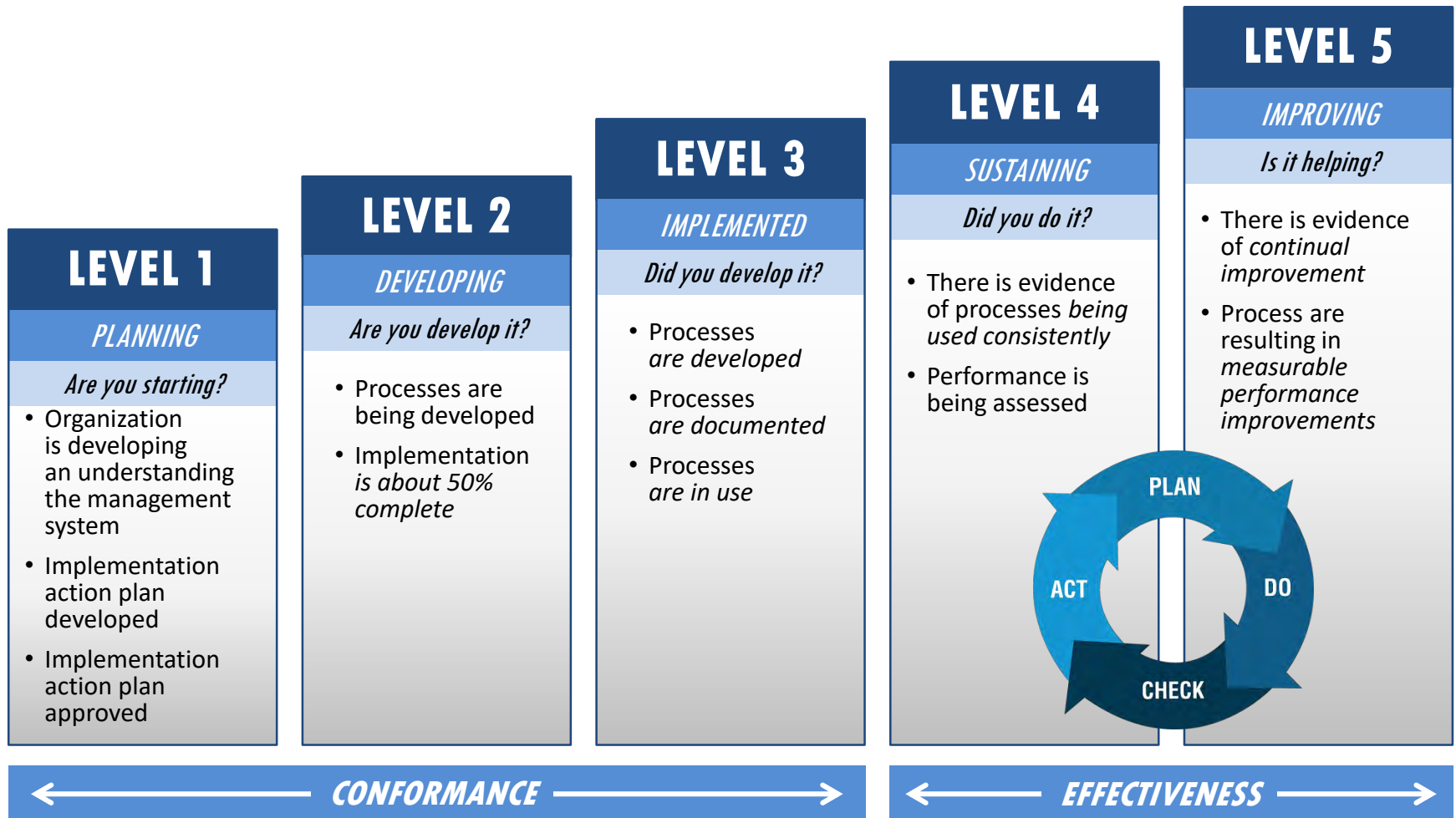
Maturity Model: A description of the levels of a maturity continuum and the characteristics, attributes, indicators or patterns associated with each stage. – API RP 1173

WHY DO WE NEED ONE?

- API RP 1173 Requires operators to “establish a method to evaluate the growth and development, otherwise known as maturity, of its PSMS”
- Pipeline SMS Industry Team developed a model to help operators meet these requirements
- If your company already has one, that is OK
- Industry needs to show improvement
- Maturity model points the way to further improvements



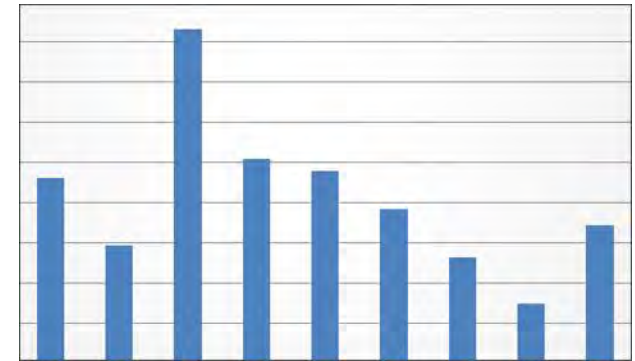
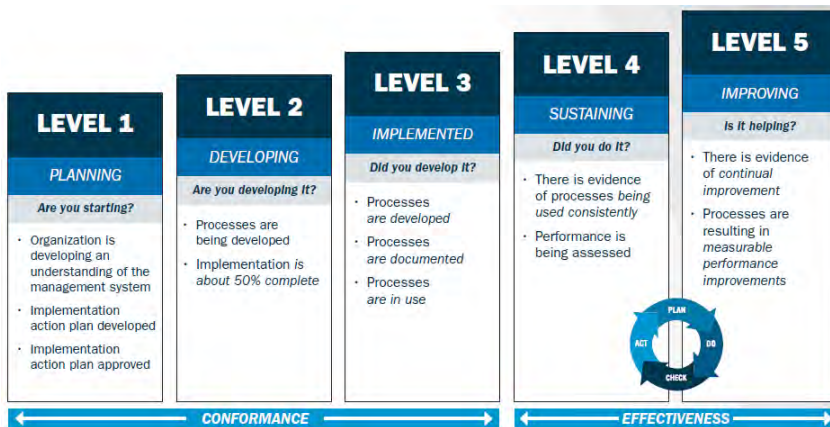
PIPELINE SMS MATURITY MODEL



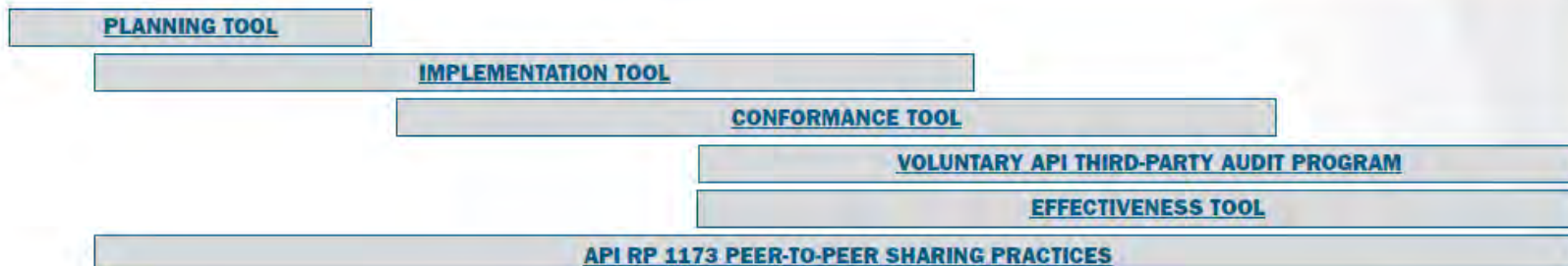
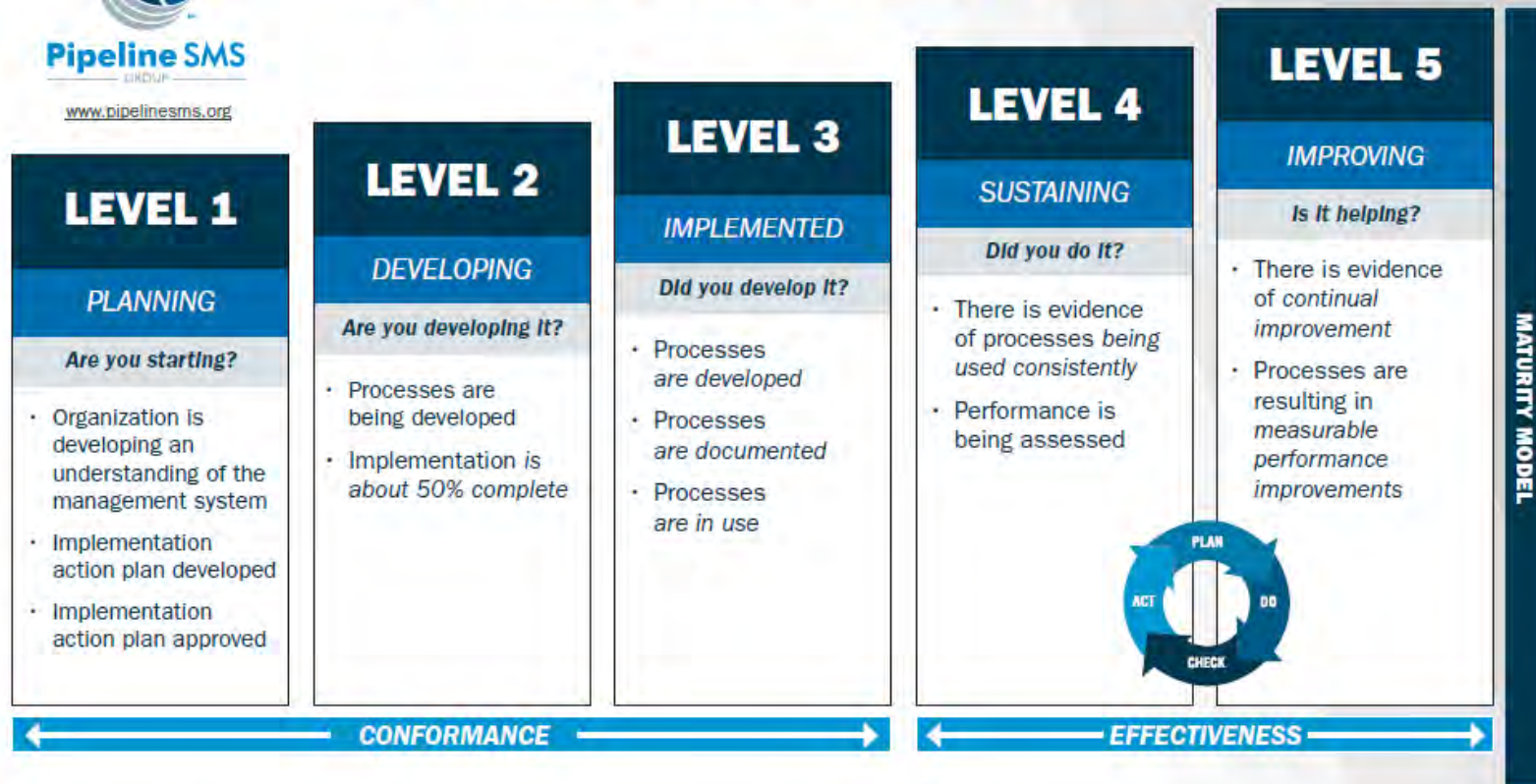
EFFECTIVENESS

Performance metrics complete the picture

- Develop a suite of 6-10 performance metrics
- Typically lagging metrics
- Choose from readily available metrics where possible
- Choose metrics meaningful to industry, regulators and the public

PLANNING TOOL

- Summary of API RP 1173 requirements (71 questions)
- A gap analysis tool to compare an operator's existing system to the requirements of API RP 1173
- Documents action plans and responsibilities to close gaps
- Helps operators achieve Level 1 maturity (develop a plan, and begin work)

IMPLEMENTATION TOOL

- Summary of API RP 1173 requirements (71 questions)
- Evaluates and summarizes the operator's implementation status by question, element and overall
- Helps operators track development of programs to implement the RP

CONFORMANCE TOOL

- Comprehensive API RP 1173 requirements (all 234 *shall* statements from the RP)
- Evaluates and summarizes the Operator's conformance to API RP 1173 by *shall* statement, element and overall
- Helps operators ensure conformance with all *shall* statements in the RP
- Tool spans Levels 2-4 as conformance requires processes are in place and effective

VOLUNTARY API THIRD-PARTY AUDIT PROGRAM

- API-administered audit program for conformance to API RP 1173
- Yields an objective evaluation and score
- Appropriate at Level 3 maturity or beyond as effectiveness will be considered

EFFECTIVENESS TOOL

- Helps operators evaluate the effectiveness of their programs in achieving the objectives of the RP (Is it helping?)
- Appropriate at Level 3 maturity or beyond as Effectiveness can be measured once the Pipeline SMS is in place
